




Cape Bowling Green lighthouse [National Archives of Australia, A6247, B32]. Another copy of the photograph is in the collection of the Burdekin Library, with this description: *Cape Bowling Green Lighthouse with Captain John Anderson Kidd, Superintendent 1902 -1912, standing on wooden platform. The foundations were undermined in May 1908 and was moved 345 metres back to higher ground. The lighthouse was replaced in 1987 and the 114 year-old tower was taken to the National Maritime Museum in Sydney. Grave site of Elizabeth M.
